Dairy Tax Credit Update

The SC Dairy Tax Credit Program paid out \$2,167,500 to 79 dairies in SC in 2005. Three quarters of the 2005 calendar year qualified for the credit because the farm price of milk was below the production price calculated by formula for the program in 2005.

In 2006, with prices down, it is expected that in all likelihood the states' dairy farmers will qualify for all four quarters of the calendar year. This program has been very timely in helping dairy farmers during a time when prices started to drop again. The Department of Agriculture has worked out a good system of administration between them and the Department of Revenue to facilitate the Dairy Tax Credit Program. There have been very few problems in getting the program working and getting the funds to the farmers. The Dairy Tax Credit Program is working well.
